



2018 FALL for PLANTS Sale – Winter Vegetable Plants Available

Type - Variety	Description
Artichoke - Green Globe	Grows 3-5' tall and flowers in early summer. Its deep green buds are 3-5" with a light purple tinge. Hearts are thick and flavorful. Expect a good harvest of 3-4 heads throughout the summer. Proven to be the most hardy variety and remains productive for at least 5 years.
Artichoke - Purple of Romagna	Grows to 6' tall. A favorite of chefs, this Italian artichoke produces 3-4" heads that vary in color from green to purple. Valued for their tenderness and attractive appearance. Can be harvested in second season. Foliage is resistant to deer.
Arugula - Astro	Astro has strap-shaped leaves, less deeply lobed than many, with a milder flavor. Heat tolerant and slow to bolt, it still prefers the cold soil of early spring and fall. Plant in fertile, moist, well-draining soil in full sun to part shade. Days to maturity: 38
Broccoli - Imperial	Dark green heads with small, attractive beads. Imperial has the best heat tolerance of the broccolis.
Broccoli - Green Magic	Well suited for harvest in summer and early fall in areas with long days and moderate heat, it also is grown for late fall harvest in California. Broccoli prefers well-drained, fertile soil high in organic matter, with consistent moisture throughout the growing season. Days to maturity: 71
Broccoli - Bay Meadows	Beautiful, blue-green, well-domed heads. This most widely-adapted variety has performed extremely well under stressful conditions from both spring and summer plantings. Broccoli prefers well-drained, fertile soil high in organic matter, with consistent moisture throughout the growing season. Days to maturity: 60
Broccoli - Waltham 29	Sturdy 20" plants produce beautiful 4-6" dark blue-green heads and an array of side shoots. This longtime favorite is excellent for cooking fresh or freezing. Withstands increasing cold for fall maturity. Heat-sensitive. Broccoli prefers well-drained, fertile soil high in organic matter, with consistent moisture throughout the growing season. Days to maturity: 74-85



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Cabbage - Integro red	Medium-sized red cabbage with uniform, high-round heads. The leaves are thick and crisp, but not tough. Keeps well in the garden. Cabbage prefers well-drained, fertile soil high in organic matter, with consistent moisture throughout the growing season. Days to maturity: 85
Cabbage - Brunswick	A large drumhead cabbage that is cold hardy and stores very well. Introduced in 1924, it is an excellent market variety that is becoming rare. Cabbage prefers well-drained, fertile soil high in organic matter, with consistent moisture throughout the growing season. Days to maturity: 90
Cabbage - Aubervilliers	12" tall and 24" wide. A savoy type cabbage with deeply crinkled leaves and heads weighing 2-4 lb. This heirloom variety was grown at least as far back as the early 1900s on the Plain of Aubervilliers, France. Bolt resistant and frost tolerant; best for fall or early winter harvest. Good for containers. Days to maturity: 75
Cauliflower - Purple of Sicily	Beautiful, brilliant purple heads weigh 2-3 lbs.; fine, sweet flavor. Heads cook to bright green. Insect-resistant variety; rich in minerals. A colorful and nutritious Italian heirloom. Days to maturity: 90
Cauliflower - Snow Crown	AAS winner. Extra early, good quality, medium-sized heads. Good tolerance to moderate fall frost. Prefers well-drained, fertile soil high in organic matter with consistent moisture throughout the growing season. Under fertility or moisture stress, can show a purplish coloration on the undersides of the heads. Days to Maturity:
Cauliflower - Denali	Large, heavy, self-wrapping heads. Good heat & humidity tolerance. Prefers well-drained, fertile soil high in organic matter with consistent moisture but good choice for soils with below-average fertility due to extensive root system. Irrigate regularly for best results. Plant seedlings 18" apart. Days to Maturity: 73
Chard - Bright Lights	Leaf stalks up to 20" tall; can be yellow, gold, orange, pink, crimson or purple. Lighter, milder flavor compared to other chards. Somewhat less frost hardy than other chards. Will overwinter in mild climates. As leaves are harvested, plant will continue to produce new leaves. Plant 4" apart. Also good for containers. Days to Maturity: 52



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Chard - Yellow	Beautiful green leaves with golden-orange contrasting stem. Used in ornamental edible landscaping. Delicious raw as baby leaves, best steamed when larger. Harvest outer stalks early or cut the whole plant to allow a second plant to grow. Prefers partial sun. Space 4”-5” apart. Days to Maturity: 30 to 55
Chard - Rhubarb	Candy-apple red stems with dark green, red-veined leaves. Cool and mild weather preferred. Mature plants are hardy to moderate frosts; may overwinter in mild areas. Plant seedlings 4” apart. Clip baby leaves just above the soil. Multiple harvests possible as plants produce new leaves. Days to Maturity: 32 baby
Kale - Toscano	Lacinato or “dinosaur” type Italian heirloom. Extra-dark green, non-curled, heavily savoyed leaves up to 24” long. Rich, tender leaves have a softer texture than curly green kales. Tolerant of hot and cold. Prefers well drained soil, high in organic matter and consistent moisture. Plant 12-18” apart for full size, 2-4” for baby. Days to Maturity: 30 baby; 65 full
Kale - Winterbor	Plants are 2-3’ tall with excellent yield and better cold hardiness. Leaves well-curled, blue-green and ruffled. Vigorous plants continue producing new leaves as the lower leaves are harvested. Plant 12-18” apart for full leaf; 2-4” apart for baby leaf production. Days to Maturity: 60
Kale - Red Russian	Red leaf kale for baby leaf and bunching. Stems are purple, leaves flat, toothed and dark green with purple veins. Plants mature medium tall and leaves are tender compared to other kales. Dunk leaves in cold water post-harvest to extend storage life. Plant 12-18” apart for full leaf; 2-4” apart for baby leaf. Days to Maturity: 25 baby; 50 full
Lettuce - Vulcan	Early, brilliantly colored red leaves. Crisp and mild. Ruffled slightly frilled leaves, candy apple red over a light green background. Slow to tip burn. Plant 8-10” apart for full size heads, 6” apart for mini heads. Days to Maturity: 52
Lettuce - Green Star	Especially attractive green leaf lettuce. Has excellent tolerance to hot weather, bolting and tip burn. Medium-sized heads with very good flavor. High resistance to downy mildew. Plant 8-10” apart for full size heads or 6” apart for mini heads. Days to Maturity: 53



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Lettuce - Green Forest Romaine	Early, tall and attractive dark green. Slow bolting. Tolerant to tip burn. Transplant 10-12” apart for full size heads or 6” apart for mini heads. Days to Maturity: 56
Lettuce - Ruby Sky	Disease resistant, late season red leaf. Dense heads, ruffled leaves intense red at the tips and green at the inner base. Good tolerance to bottom rot. Slower growing and slower bolting than Vulcan. Plant 8-10” apart for full size heads or 6” apart for mini heads. Days to Maturity: 58
Peas, Shelling - Maxigolt	Outstanding late variety with large, very sweet, dark green berries. Attractive, broad, 3 ½” pods. Vines average 3 ½-4’ (5’ in fertile soil.) Can be grown with or without support. Harvest when peas enlarge in the pod. Plant 1-1 ½” apart. Days to Maturity: 62
Peas, Snow - Avalanche	High yielding, dark green snow pea. Pods are typically harvested at 3 ¾-4” but may be harvested at 2 ½”. Vines average 36” & produce more tendrils than typical peas. Tendrils make excellent garnishes. May be grown with or without support. High resistance to fusarium wilt. Days to Maturity: 60
Radicchio - mixed	Mixed radicchio and chicory. Mid-Early. Assortment of the best varieties for growth and flavor for your salad bowl. Cut-and-come-again.
Romanesco - Veronica	Lime green heads with pointed, spiraled pinnacles. Slightly nutty and more flavorful than white varieties. High resistance to fusarium yellows. Plant 18” apart. When small white heads become visible through leaves, gather the outer leaves over the head & tie with string or large rubber band to avoid sun exposure. Days to Maturity: 78
Spinach - Kookaburra	Fast growing semi-savoy. Upright variety makes it easy to harvest. Attractive dark-green, round leaves. Great flavor. High resistance to downy mildew. Plant 2-4” apart. For baby leaf, harvest every 7 days for continuous supply. For full size harvest before bolting. Days to Maturity: 26
Spinach - Corvair	Very dark green smooth-leaf spinach. Slow bolting. Upright plants hold well. High resistance to downy mildew. For baby leaf, harvest every 7 days for continuous supply. For full size harvest before bolting. Days to Maturity: 27
